Egon Spengler's PARENTS' GUIDE FOR HEALTH AND SAFETY

Health and Safety Warning: This Shopping Cart May Be Hazardous to Your Child's Health

It's true! Your child may even have had a run-in with a shopping cart already. These mobile mishaps were involved in more than 19,000 injuries to children in 1990; 15,251 of these incidents involved head and/or facial injuries, including fractured skulls. In fact, falls from shopping carts are now listed among the leading causes of head injuries in children under the age of 5.

So a few safety tips from Egon are in order here:

• Never let your child sit in the food basket part of the cart. He or she may get impatient or try to climb out. This is when carts tip over ... food, child, and all.

- Never allow your child to sit on the rack under the basket, either. It's not big enough to hold a kid. Furthermore, fingers, hands, feet, and clothing can easily get caught in the wheels.
- Put your child in the seat portion of the cart. Use the seat belt, if one is available. If your child is too big for the seat, he or she should walk beside you.
- Finally, never—ever—leave your child unattended in a shopping cart.

Diarrhea Dilemma

There's no question about it; diarrhea is no fun. But something that will probably make you and your child feel much better is a set of guidelines to help you figure out when it's more than just a mild case. These symptoms mean that a physician should be contacted:

- Blood is in the stool.
- The child hasn't urinated for more than eight hours.
- · Diarrhea has continued

for more than two days.

- It gets worse even though you've been feeding your child a bland diet.
- Vomiting accompanies the diarrhea.
- Your child has had a fever of more than 101 degrees Fahrenheit for more than 24 hours.
- Signs of dehydration are present: sunken eyes, abnormal drowsiness or lethargy, and no discernible saliva.

Babysitter Basics

fiances are that if you've got a kid, you've used a babysitter. Or maybe one of your children is a babysitter. Either way, this information will interest you.

A nationwide survey has shown that an alarming number of parents who use young babysitters do not leave them phone numbers in case of emergency. This includes numbers for doctors, community emergency services, neighbors, or even numbers where the parents could be reached.

to specifically
ask for the numbers before

house.

to these tips:

• If you're using a space heater, keep it at least 36 inches away from anything that is combustible; this includes wallpaper, bedding clothing pets, and most importantly, people!

Turn off space heaters if

you're not going to be in the room or when you go to bed.

• Keep children and pets away from them at all times, and never leave children or pets unattended while a space heater is on.

• Remember that a space heater is not a dryer; wet clothing such as mittens and socks should never be placed on one to dry.

These are just the basic dos and don'ts. Read your owner's manual for more safety tips.

Don't combine household cleaners. Mixed together, they can create fumes that are poisonous to you and your children.




