Dear NOW,

Some final thoughts on the conclusion of your GHOSTBUSTERS II miniseries. Y'know, I still haven't seen the damned movie yet. The rate things are going, I suspect I'll have to wait until it comes out in video and rent the crazy thing. But at least I have this book to give me a rough idea of the plot. I have to confess that it was kind of disconcerting to have to imagine the real-life actors like Bill Murray, Dan Akroyd, and the others doing these things when your artist was drawing them the way they look in the Real Ghostbusters cartoon (and, of course, your monthly comic.) It was weird, bu then almost everything about the Ghostbusters universe is weird, so

this is just par for the course. Of course, the concept of making the Statue of Liberty mobile may be going a bit far...All things considered, this is one of the better movie adaptations to comics format that I've encountered in a good many years and I hope that in future movie tie-ins Now Comics will continue to display the same amount of skill and faithfulness that I found here. While I've got

you here, I also want to point out that I did notice, in the most recent issue of THE REAL GHOSTBUSTERS. that you made mention Janine's flirting with Louis in the movie, and the effect it might have on her relationship with Egon. I approve of this; I know it isn't easy, but any sense of continuity you folks can keep with the movies and TV series is a plus as

far as I'm concerned. It's tricky, but when you can pull it off, the story in general becomes all the more satisfying. This in itself leads to another question: when is your monthly Ghostbusters book going to start using some of the villains from eisodes of the cartoon show, such as the Boogeyman, Samhain, or the Sandman? Those three spirits are obviously much smarter than the Ghostbusters' normal antagonists, and should be more than capable of making comebacks here and there for maximum effect. I also think that there's a little more room for improvement in the way the book is presented overall. I realize that you want to base the book as much as possible on

the look of the TV show, and I don't disagree with that. I also understand that because it's cartoons and due to the time slot it has that the show's primary audience is little kids. But you're already tailoring the SLIMER! book for little kids; I don't want THE REAL GHOSTBUSTERS doing the same thing. I'd like to see the maturity level come up to about where RACER-X and TERMINATOR are right



now. This would make it possible for a wider range of age groups to enjoy the book. As it stands now, you're kind of straddling the fence; it wouldn't take much of a push for the series to become a little more sophisticated. At least promise me you'll think about it, hey?

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






























































NOW NEWSPLASH

Time for a plug! All of you Green Hornet fanatics should take a note on this one. Coming this March is the Green Hornet lithograph of the Jim Steranko cover for The Green Hornet Issue Number One! That's right! From Graphitti Designs to you! This collector's piece will have a limited run of only 1,500 copies, and the orders are already coming in, so don't wait to get yours. But why do you want a lithograph of the cover when you can look at the cover itself? A number of reasons here: First, In the opinion of the artist, Jim Steranko, the cover painting was not completed at the time of run. Perfection takes time, and, having just seen the original at a convention, after Mr. Steranko had done more work on it, I must admit that the difference between the printed piece and its current state was startling. Even then, Mr. Steranko admitted that he was not finished with it. So, what you're getting with this lithograph is practically a brand new painting. Secondly, being a lithograph, the quality will be so near to the original that you probably couldn't tell them apart. And the lithograph will appear without the logo, so there won't be anything covering up that lovely painting. And third, each lithograph will be signed by the artist himself, Mr. Jim Steranko.
