





















Up a Tree Without Safety

ippee! It's almost time to pack your kids in the car and go in search of the perfect Christmas tree. Only this year, resolve to do all you can to select the freshest, least dry tree that you can. Then it will really be perfect. Why is this so important? Well, the risk of fire is practically at its peak this time of year. (We've all listened to news reports of tragic fires at Christmas time.) A dry tree just adds to a potential threat. Here are three simple tests you can do to make sure your tree is fresh

Bend the needles. Fresh needles spring back and do not

break when bent.

before you buy it.

 Bounce the tree on its trunk. If more than a few needles fall, that means it's too dry.

 Rub your fingers across the bottom of the trunk. If you don't feel the stickiness of the stump, the tree is too dry.

Good Nutrition Is in the Bag

Wondering what to pack your kids for lunch? This is a real stumper for parents who want to guarantee that the good nutrition habits they've been teaching their children at home will last through lunchtime at school. According to a nutritionist at the Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. Texas, children take their food habits to school. And if the home habits are good, then the away-from-home habits will also be good. Try

these "changes of taste" on your kids:

• Substitute crunchy veggies for the bag of chips.

- Serve sandwiches on different bread for variety; don't forget pita pockets and flour tortillas for fun.
- Canned fruit and miniyogurts are popular with kids.
- For protien, serve cheese, left-over pizza, peanut butter, or cooked meats such as roast beef or turkey.

Play-time Toy Tips

urely this has happened to you: You're in a toy store with your kids, and they see something they want. They nag you mercilessly to buy it. Most of the time you're probably tempted to say "no." But, just in case you're about to say "okay," and buy a toy, you need to do one more important thing: Read the packaging to find out what age the toy is intended for. Toy manufacturers will often list this information. This means that a toy intended for a nine-year-old is too developmentally advanced for a five-year-old. Remember that toys that come in many little pieces are dangerous for a toddler to play with (infants and toddlers can choke on those little pieces). Always be alert to toys that have sharp edges, use projectiles, make loud noises, or require the use of batteries; these toys have more than just the usual hazards.

Candle, Candle Burning Bright

Candles are a big part of celebrating the holiday season. Whether your candles are for Hanukkah or Christmas, make sure they are kept away from flammable and inflammable materials. out of children's reach, and away from places where they could get knocked over. Make sure matches are put away, too. Now's the time to do all you can to practice fire safety in your home. It's also time to test the batteries in your smoke detector. (You have installed smoke detectors, haven't you?)

Get a Grip on Yourself

Parenting can be frustrating sometimes, and frustration may lead to anger. Don't take your anger out on your kids, and don't turn your anger inward. If you ever feel like you can't get a grip on yourself, these tips can help you out of a heated situation.

• Count to ten. Yes, this really does work.

It will slow down your actions and give you at least ten seconds to think about what you are doing or saying.

• Take a break from the situation. Go somewhere else to get

yourself away from the person or circumstance involved.

• Be assertive, not aggressive. Calming your own anger is a skill that can be learned, and your children will learn from

your example.



e on the lookout for signs of frostbite and hypothermia in your children if they've been out in the cold or snow. Numbness and a white discoloration of the skin are cues that frostbite may indeed have bitten your little one. Shivering is the first sign of hypothermia, a dangerous lowering of the body's temperature.



If your children are cereal eaters, don't rely on fruit-containing cereals to provide your children with their daily quota of fruit. Most boxes have only one or two ounces of fruit in the entire box. Best bet: Serve fresh fruit with their cereal.

If you're looking for ways to encourage your kids to get some "real" exercise (aerobic, that is), have them turn on the radio and start dancing. It's fun; it helps develop coordination; it can be done either alone or with a friend; and when done at a reasonable pace, it burns calories, giving the body a good workout. You might even want to join in the fun!

1992 is just around the corner, parents, so make those New Year's resolutions now. Here are a few ideas to start you off: I will always listen to my child.

I will be the best parent I can be.




