Fasten your seatbelts! When you go to the movies this winter, you'll be off on one fantastic trip after another.



#### Book Business





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

## How Do They Contract?

Special Effects, called "fx" by the experts, make all of the movie magic you saw in Ghostbusters II possible. Here's the scoop from someone who knows-special effects producer Janet Mohler.

lanet Mohler works for a company called Industrial Light and Magic (ILM), the experts behind the "fx" in Ghostbusters II. "We knew going in that Ghostbusters II was going to be tough," said Janet. "There were so many special effects. You did one, working hard to get the look and the shot. Then there were 10 more!"

The crew at II M worked on Ghostbusters II seven days a week for nearly six months. That may seem like a long time, but it took every minute to make so many amazing effects appear on screen.

#### **GETTING THE GHOSTS**

When Slimer zips and whizzes through the air, it looks like the Ghostbusters' pal is really alive. But he was never in those shots at all!

In the scenes with Slimer, the actors had to bretend that he was there. Later an actress dressed in a Slimer costume was shot on a separate piece of film as she swung back and forth on wires in

front of a plain blue sceen. Then the blue background was taken out by a special filter. Finally, the two pieces of film were joined, and it looked just like Slimer was there with the Ghostbusters!

Was that the hardest effect to make? No way! "It was even harder to get the Statue of Liberty to look right," says Janet. "Everyone knows what she looks like, so that costume had to be perfect. Then we had to make her come to life! We shot those scenes many, many times to get the stiff movement of a statue walking just right."

Some of the statue's scenes were shot on a miniature set of the city. A few used "matte" backgrounds, paintings on glass that are so

detailed they look like they really are New York City.

#### COMPUTERIZED CREATURES

The Creature Shop at ILM is where all the ghosts are brought to life. Sculptors create small clay figures out of foam, fiberglass or whatever is needed.

For a ghost like Slimer, who has to react to things around him, even more work is needed to make him look real. "Slimer's head was very complicated," says Janet. "It was computerized, and lots of his expressions were programmed into the computer. We made them appear at the right time by remote control."

#### MONDO SPECIAL EFFECTS

Scenes like the courtroom take-over by the Scolari brothers used as many as fifty different special effects! Some, like the proton beams, were drawn onto the film, frame by frame. Others are mixed in later when a film editor takes all the pieces of film and puts them together where they are refilmed in a special machine to make the special effect you see on screen. "It's very time consuming," Janet says.

#### ///SLIME TIME//

The hardest part of the movie was working with the slime! Even though they start with the same kind you buy in toy stores, the slime you see in the movie has been lit, colored, and shot a dozen different ways. "The director really wanted it to look like like a whole bunch of souls were trapped inside," Janet says. To do it, they needed truckloads of the gooey stuff. "A thousand gallons!" Janet exclaims. "That's a lot of slime!"


"So much for a free vacation," groaned Winston.

"Yeah," grumbled Peter. "But it's going to be awfully sticky in there!"



### SCIENCE AND **TECH REPORT**

Kikes! You scared me! I thought you might have been Slimer. You see, I'm trying to create ghost bait out of some common hairy fungus. However, Slimer keeps stealing the samples before I have a chance to test them.

Well, no matter, you're here for a different reason, so let me tell you about the hottest news from wide world of science.



#### MISSION TO MARS

Mars. The Red Planet. The eerie red coloring of its lavaencrusted surface has fascinated people since it was first discovered centuries ago. Its mountains are taller than Mt. Everest, and it has canyons far larger than the Grand Canyon. The Red Planet is so foreboding that people have always been afraid that its inhabitants would invade the earth.

Today scientists believe that nobody, indeed, no thing, lives on Mars.

Indeed, instead, Earthlings will soon be invading Mars! President Bush has pledged to send men to Mars within the next 30 years.

Astronauts will spend a year travelling and exploring Mars on the 35,000,000 mile mission.

#### ICE HOUSE

Imagine a big bunch of snow and ice the size of the Stay Puft Marshmallow Man's foot. Well,

that's what an igloo looks like. But why, you ask, would anyone want to live in something that looks like a big marshmallow foot?

It turns out that igloos have been used by native arctic tribes, called Inuits (you might have heard them called Eskimos, but that's not really the right name). The people who live in this bitterly cold climate don't actually live in igloos all year long. They spend most of their time in wooden homes. but when they take long trips and need a warm overnight shelter, they build igloos. Igloos are exceptionally sturdy houses because their construction relies on principles of physics and meteorology (the study of the weather).

Inuit men take the first step in building an igloo. They dig a shallow hole out of a snowdrift. Then they cut several blocks of

firm snow about three feet long and two feet thick. They place the blocks in a circle and shape them so they slant inward. As the structure grows, the blocks are made smaller so they form a dome.

Next, Inuit women take a hot oil lamp inside and the entrance is closed so no cold air can get in. Soon it is very hot inside the ice dome, and the walls begin to melt. The dome shape prevents water from dripping off the walls, they just get wet. When all of the blocks are soaked through, the door is quickly opened and a gust of bitterly cold air rushes in. The air is so cold it instantly freezes the wet blocks into hard ice that insulates the igloo. Now it is weather and polar bear proof, and it's toasty warm inside!

And by the way, igloos may seem like they are easy to make, but they aren't. So you should never try to make one yourself. You could have a snow cave on your head!!!







#### **CHARGE IT!**

Do you get a charge out of playing with balloons? It's not surprising!

Electricity is the force that causes a balloon to stick to your body after you rub it on your hair. It's also the reason you sometimes see sparks when you take laundry out of the dryer. This sort of electricity is called **static electricity**. Static electricity occurs when negatively and positively charged surfaces react to each other, creating an electro-magnetic force.

Here's an experiment called the **Jumping Pepper Trick**. It will demonstrate the invisible force of static electricity.

I. Pour some salt and pepper onto a plate and mix them up.

Take a rubber comb and rub it up and down very quickly against a piece of cloth (creating a negative charge on the comb).

3. Hold the comb about an inch above the plate.

4. Watch the action!

The pepper should jump off

the plate and stick to the comb while the salt stays behind.

That's because as the comb comes near the salt and pepper, the positively charged pepper reacts with the comb-creating static electricity!

#### 3-D TV

How would you like to chase ghosts along with Slimer, me, and the guys?

Soon advanced laser technology is going to allow you to join us as we chase ectoplasmic apparitions! When you watch TV in the year 2015, it might seem like the action you see on a television show is actually happening in the room with you. You'll be "into" your favorite show, literally!

In the next century, some televisions will probably be equipped with special screens. Lasers will reflect off of holograms to produce a three-dimensional image that actually moves on those screens!

You might already be familiar with holograms. Take a look at one of your parent's credit

cards. You will probably find a shiny picture in the corner, and it will change shapes if you wiggle the card.

Holograms are created by taking hundreds of photographs of an object, from all different angles, and then merging those photographs to form the three dimensional image.

3-D TV will take that technology one step further and move the image for you. In other words, you won't have to wiggle a card in your hand to make it change shapes.

And by the way, 3-D TV means something else is on the way-3-D video games! The same technology that will make it seem like you are chasing ghosts with us will put you in the action of your favorite video game.

One day when you battle hostile aliens on your TV, it might seem as if you are actually in the cockpit of a starfighter with the enemy hot on your tail!


